“Back in 2002, we sustained a cut to an employee’s top lip (which required a single stitch) when a shifting spanner was dropped while installing a stainless steel launder under 3.09 Conveyor,” explained PHFF’s Terry Bender.

“Although we are very proud of our achievement, PHFF recognises this performance will remain a challenge for our team, with the demand on our current workforce constantly growing and the ongoing introduction of new employees. We need to remain focused on the training and implementation of PWCS policies and procedures, such as Take 5, STEPSafe.
